A psychopath usually is one from genetics or congenital injury at birth, rather than environmental factors. Extremely manipulative, they can easily gain trust, but don't necessarily form attachments. Psychopaths lack empathy and feel no remorse. Usually, their crimes are preplanned and highly organized and meticulous. From a criminal point of view, they are more dangerous than sociopaths because of their lack of empathy

Psychopathy is traditionally a personality disorder characterized by persistent antisocial behavior, impaired empathy, remorse, and bold disinhibited, and egotistical traits. (Hare, Robert D. (1999). 


## Famous Psychopaths



Edmund Kemper is a psychopathic serial killer. At 6'9", 280 pounds, he's a giant with a high IQ. He used to frequent the same bars as the police, escaping their detection every time. He murdered 6 co-eds, his mother, and her friend before finally turning himself in. He is still in prison as of 2020.



Charles Manson is a famous cult leader. He formed the Manson Family that killed 9 in 1969, at four locations. Some of the more famous murdered were Sharon Tate and Rosemary LaBianca, both Hollywood Elite. Charles died in prison in 2017. Other members of the Manson family remain in prison.



Theodore Robert Bundy is a classic Psychopathic Serial Killer. From 1974 to 1978 he killed approximately 30 people in California, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Oregon, Utah, and Washington. He was found guilty and sentenced to death, but escaped in 1977. Recaptured in 1978, and executed in 1989.



Ed Gein, between 1947 and 1952, killed his mother and one more, and dug up over 40 graves to exhume and utilize body parts. Ed then created many items with human flesh, including purses, shoes, and was in the process of making a woman suit of his mother when he was captured. He died awaiting trial in 1968.
